



Sri Lanka harvested a crop of 19.5Mkg during the Month of December 2022 which is a negative variance of 4.9% when compared to the crop harvested in December 2021. Incidentally, this is the lowest production reported for the month of December since the year 2008 which was 19.4Mkg.

The main contributor for the 19.5Mkg was from the Low Grown planting districts with 62.9%, followed by High Growns at 22.1% and the Medium Growns at 14.9%. When compared with the crop in 2021, negative variances have been recorded in the High Growns at 5%, Low Growns at 4% and the Medium Growns at 10%.

The cumulative tea production for the year 2022 was 251.5Mkg which is a significant decline of 16% YoY. This too is the lowest recorded since the year 1995 which was 245.9Mkg.

## **COMMENTS**



The 0.94Mkg of Ex estate teas on offer met with lower demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs appreciated selectively following special inquiry. The below best and plainer varieties were easier. Select Best Western High Grown BOPFs were selectively dearer following special inquiry, the below best and plainer varieties were easier. Nuwara Eliya BOP/BOPFs were mostly unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were easier from last week' s levels, and the corresponding BOPF's too declined. Uva BOPs were irregularly easier, the BOPFs were barely steady. Low grown CTC BP1s were firm, the High and Medium sorts were tending irregular. Low Grown CTC PF1s maintained last levels, the High and Medium PF1s were irregular.

The 3.0Mkg of Low Grown teas which were on offer met with good demand. In the Leafy segment, OPs/OPA's were firm. OP1s were mostly firm. In the Semi Leafy segment, BOP1s were lower to last. Pekoe varieties appreciated following quality. Pekoe1s were firm. In the Small Leaf segment, FBOPs were firm. FBOPF/FF1 varieties were significantly lower with a large volume remaining unsold. BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOPSP and BOPs met with reasonable demand. Premium Flowery teas were lower.

Turkey, Russia and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Iran was very selective. Libya and Iraq were active.





## **MARKET DESCRIPTION**

#### **Western Teas**

Select best BOPs were firm to Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- dearer at times following quality and special inquiry, the below best and plainer varieties were tending easier by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/-. Select best BOPFs were dearer following quality and special inquiry, the below best and plainer varieties declined irregularly between Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- on average. Medium BOPs were firm Rs.50/- easier, the BOPFs were firm to irregularly lower.

#### **Nuwara Eliya Teas**

BOP/ BOPFs mostly remained unsold due to inadequate bids.

#### **Uva Teas**

Uva BOPs were barely steady, the BOPFs were firm on last levels. Uda Pussellawa BOPs declined by Rs.100/- to Rs.200/-, the BOPFs too were easier by Rs.100/- to Rs.150/-.

#### **CTC Teas**

Low Grown BP1s were firm, the High and Medium sorts were tending irregular. Low Grown PF1s maintains last levels, the High and Medium sorts were firm to irregularly lower following quality.

## MARKET DESCRIPTION



#### **Low Grown**

Select best wiry OP1s along with the other good OP1 invoices were firm to dearer, secondaries too were firm on last levels. Well-made OPs gained on quality, secondaries met with fair demand. Well-made OPAs were firm on last levels, others too were steady. In the Semi Leafy segment, all BOP1s shed by Rs.50/- to Rs.80/- with lower demand experienced throughout the sale. Well-made Pekoes along with the heavy bold Pekoe invoices were fully firm to dearer. Shotty Pekoe1s met with good demand, others too continued a similar trend.

Select best BOPs were firm, best types were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best types were irregularly lower to last, secondary types were firm. BOP.SPs and BOPF.SPs met with reasonable demand. BOPFs followed a similar trend. Select best and best FBOPF1s were substantially lower by Rs.100/- to Rs.150/-, below best FBOPF1s were lower by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-, secondaries too were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-. Well-made FBOPs in the select best category were firm, best and below best types were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, secondaries were firm. FBOPF varieties met with lower demand. All Premium Flowery teas were substantially lower by Rs.100/- to Rs.200/- and more following quality.

#### **Off Grades**

Select best and best FGS1 were easier by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best and best BMs were easier by Rs.20/-, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best and best BPs declined by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/- and more, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best BOP1As were dearer by Rs.150/- to Rs.200/- whilst best BOP1As were dearer by Rs.100/- to Rs.130/-, below best and poorer sorts were dearer by Rs.30/- to Rs.60/- and more at times.

#### **Dust**

Select best and best Dust1s were irregularly dearer by Rs. 5/- to Rs.10/-, below best types depreciated by Rs.5/-, poorer sorts sold at last levels. High and Medium CTCs maintained at last levels. Low Grown CTCs appreciated Rs.10/- to Rs.15/-. Low Grown Dust/Dust1s were dearer by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-.








Crop intakes are low.






Mediums – KTDA mediums were mainly firm with only a few teas varying between dearer by up to USC14 and easier by USC4 and USC24 while plantation mediums shed up to USC39.
