There was widespread demand at the Colombo Auction for the 5.16Mkg on offer, despite global unrest and unstable economies. The limited auction volumes on offer for future sales and current production levels are reasons for the prevailing interest by most exporters. The devaluation of the Sri Lankan rupee and the increase in crude oil prices are also reasons for the strong demand currently witnessed. The challenge faced by exporters will be securing containers / vessels for their future shipments.

The 0.80Mkg of Ex-Estate teas on offer met with irregular demand. Select best Western High Grown BOPs appreciated following special inquiry, however the below best and plainer varieties were easier. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs were lower, whilst the below best and plainer varieties appreciated. Nuwara Eliya BOPs were irregular, the BOPFs were barely steady. Udapusellawa BOPs were dearer, the BOPFs too advanced following quality. Uva BOPs were dearer, the BOPFs were firm to dearer at times. Low Grown CTC BP1s were easier, the High and Medium sorts were tending irregular. Low Grown CTC PF1s appreciated and gained further as the sale progressed, the High and Medium sorts too were firm to dearer.

The 2.1Mkg of Low Grown teas which were on offer met with good demand. In the Leafy segment, select best OPs were firm whilst the others met with improved demand. Well-made OPAs witnessed improved levels whilst the others were dearer. Better OP1s were dearer, others too appreciated following quality. In the Semi Leafy segment BOP1s met with good demand. Pekoe varieties gained a few rupees. The top end of the Pekoe1s were firm, others sold at improved levels. In the Small Leaf segment, FBOPs met with better demand. FBOPF1s were dearer. FBOPFs sold at improved levels. BOPF.SP, BOPF and BOP.SP met with good demand whilst BOP too followed a similar trend. All Premium Flowery teas were dearer.

Russia, Iran and the C.I.S countries lent good support whilst improved interest was noticed from Turkey. Libya and Iraq were active.







MARKET DESCRIPTION

Western Teas

Select best BOPs appreciated following special inquiry, the others were firm to Rs.20/- to Rs.30/- easier, the below best and plainer varieties were firm to a little easier at times. Select best BOPFs eased Rs.20/- to Rs.30/- and more, however the below best and plainer sorts were firm to Rs.10/- to Rs.20/- dearer. Medium BOPs were firm to a little dearer, the BOPFs were easier by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, however the poorer sorts gained irregularly.

Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOPs were irregularly dearer, the BOPFs were barely steady.

Uva Teas

BOPs were tending dearer, the BOPFs were firm to irregularly dearer. Udapussellawa BOPs too appreciated from last week's levels, the BOPFs too improved following quality.

CTC Teas

Low Grown BP1s were easier, the High and Medium sorts were irregular. Low Grown PF1s gained Rs.30/- to Rs.40/ as the sale progressed, the High and Medium sorts were irregularly dearer following quality.

Low Grown

Wiry OP1s along with the bolder types gained by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/- and more at times. Better twisted OPs were firm, others gained by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Select best OPAs met with fair demand, best and below best types were firm to dearer. Well-made BOP1s were firm, others too met with reasonable demand. Well-made Pekoes were firm, bolder invoices increased by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best types too gained by Rs.20/- and more at times. Shotty Pekoe1s were mainly firm, others gained by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-.

Select best well-made BOPs were dearer by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-, best and below best types were firm, secondary types too were firm. Select best and best BOP.SPs and BOPF.SPs met with fair demand, others were firm. BOPFs followed a similar trend. Select best and best FBOPF1s were dearer by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-, below best and secondary types were firm. Well-made FBOPs in the select best category were firm, best and below best types were lower by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-, secondary types were firm. FBOPF varieties met with good demand. All Premium Flowery teas met with good demand.

Off Grades

Select best and best FGS1s were easier by Rs.10/-, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best and best BMs were firm, below best and poorer types showed a similar trend. All BPs were firm on last. Select best and best BOP1As were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, others met with good demand.

Dust

Select best and best Dust1s were lower by Rs.10/- to Rs.15/-, below best types sold at firm levels, poorer sorts depreciated by Rs.10/-. Best High and Medium CTCs sold at firm levels. Low Grown CTCs depreciated by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Low Grown Dust/Dust1s were firm to dearer by Rs.10/-.

Crop

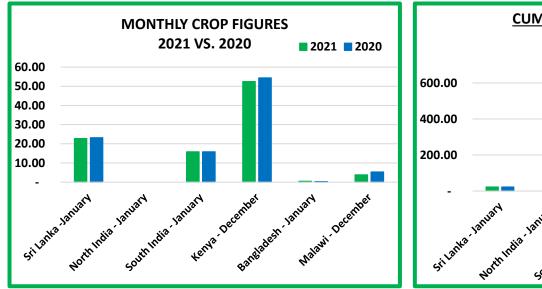

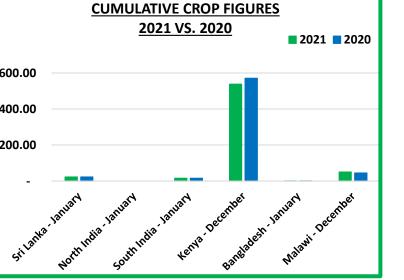

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MOMBASA MARKET

SALE NO. 09 - SALE OF 28TH FEBRUARY, 01ST / 02ND MARCH 2022

Reduced demand for the 192,659 packages (12,692,040.00 kilos) in the market particularly for Leaf Grades with prices closely following quality; 14.76% remained without bids.

OFFERINGS

Leaf Grades	-	106,464 packages (6,972,141.00 kilos) with 14.62% neglected.
Dust Grades	-	56,939 packages (4,225,074.00 kilos) and 11.91% were unsold.
Secondary Grades	-	29,256 packages (1,494,825.00 kilos); 20.85% remained unsold.

MARKETS

Pakistan Packers and Bazaar showed reduced activity with Egyptian Packers active at lower levels. Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries maintained enquiry while Sudan lent good but selective interest. UK, Kazakhstan and other CIS nations showed less activity with Russia noticeably absent while Afghanistan and Iran were subdued. Local Packers maintained activity based on price. Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.

LEAF GRADES (M2)

BP1:

Best – Saw less inquiry and were heavily discounted by up to USC52.
Brighter – Irregular, ranging between steady to USC10 dearer to easier by up to USC18.
Mediums – KTDAs were fully firm where sold with plantations irregular, varying between firm to USC18 dearer to easier by USC9.
Lower Mediums – Ranged between firm to USC16 dearer to USC14 below previous levels.
Plainer – Met irregular interest varying between USC2 to USC14 above last rates to easier by USC12.

<u>PF1:</u>

Best – Shed up to USC16.
Brighter – Were easier by USC4 to USC24.
Mediums – Steady to USC15 below last levels.
Lower Mediums – Met reduced activity and lost up to USC20.
Plainer – Eased by USC3 to USC20 but a few lines advanced by up to USC10.

DUST GRADES (M1)

PDUST:

Best – Met reduced interest and lost USC2 to USC12.
Brighter – Were a weak feature and were discounted by up to USC28.
Mediums – Steady to USC9 easier for plantation mediums while KTDA mediums lost up to USC20.
Lower Medium – Firm to USC12 below previous levels.
Plainer – Saw good but irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC12.

DUST1:

Best – Shed USC7 to USC30.
Brighter – Eased by USC10 to USC30.
Mediums – Lost up to USC11.
Lower Medium – Were firm to USC5 dearer for a few teas with most lines easier by up to USC10.
Plainer – Irregular varying between firm to USC9 dearer to easier by up to USC10.

SECONDARY GRADES (S1)

In the Secondary Catalogues, best BPs were discounted while others were dearer with PFs about steady. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were firm while similar DUSTs held value. Other Fannings were barely steady with DUSTs firm. BMFs were well absorbed.

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CHITTAGONG MARKET SALE NO.43 – 07TH MARCH 2022

CTC LEAF: 11,058 packages of Current Season and 20 packages of New Season teas on offer met with a stronger demand.

BROKENS: A small weight of good Brokens on offer met with a strong demand and sold at dearer rates. Medium varieties met with a better demand and were mostly firm to a little dearer. Plain types were well absorbed often at valuation and sometimes above. BLF teas met with a similar trend.

FANNINGS: A few good liquoring Fannings on offer were strongly competed for and were dearer. The remainder witnessed better demand and sold at slightly dearer rates and there were hardly any withdrawals. BLF teas sold well at slightly dearer rates.

CTC DUST: 3,501 packages of Current Season and 10 packages of New Season teas on offer met with good demand. Only a few invoices of clean liquoring Dusts sold at around last levels. Others were also well supported by the buyers and were slightly dearer closely following quality. There were hardly any withdrawals. Blenders lent good support along with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: This was the pen-ultimate sale of the season where offerings were much smaller than previous sale. Both Blenders and Loose tea buyers operated actively bidding on all varieties on offer. As a result, withdrawals were nominal.

In view of low offerings, sales 44 & 45 will be combined which will take place on 14th March 2022.

Dusts sold well.

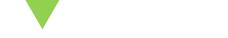

CIRCULAR NO.08 OF 2022

E-PLATFORM LEVY

With further reference to Circular number 18 of 2021 dated 06th September 2021 on the above subject. The CTTA Committee at its meeting held on 03rd March 2022, decided on the following;

- 1. The current levy of 0.05 cents per Kg each is payable by Sellers and Buyers on the Quantity Sold / Purchased shall be revised to 0.20 cents per Kg each with effect from Sale Number 14 of 04th /05th April 2022.
- 2. The CTTA, shall review the requirements of the finances of the E-Platform from time to time. Accordingly, the levy shall be revised either upwards or downwards. However, in any future revisions envisaged, the levy shall not exceed the 0.30 cents per Kg each, paid by Sellers and Buyers.

The next Revision will be decided by the Committee as required.
