COMMENTS



The Global tea auction centres experienced mixed demand, with price fluctuations mostly based on the quality of leaf and liquor, where Improved / bright teas made moderate gains in most markets. The lower end of the market was discounted and difficult of sale.

0.85Mkg of Ex- Estate teas on offer met with lower demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs declined sharply, the below best and plainer varieties too eased irregularly. Select Best Western High Grown BOPFs declined substantially, the below best and plainer varieties too followed a similar trend with a large volume remaining unsold due to a lack of suitable bids. Nuwara Eliya BOPs / BOPFs mostly remained unsold. Uda Pussellawa BOPs eased from last week's levels, the BOPFs were tending dearer. Uva BOPs barely maintained, the BOPF were tending irregular. Low Grown CTC BP1s barely maintained last levels, the limited available High and Medium BP1 were irregular. Low Grown CTC PF1s were firm, High and Medium sorts maintained last levels.

The 2.1Mkg of Low Grown teas on offer met with fair demand. In the Leafy segment, well-made OPs/OPAs were lower to last, others gained irregularly. Select best and best OP1s were lower, others were firm to dearer. BOP1s were lower to last. PEKOEs were firm on last, shotty PEKOE1s were firm, others gained irregularly. In the Small Leaf segment, FBOPs were lower to last. FBOPF1s were firm to easier. The BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOP.SP and BOPs were firm to easier. FBOPF varieties were firm to dearer. Premium Flowery teas met with fair demand.

Turkey, Russia and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Libya and Iraq were active.





MARKET DESCRIPTION

Western Teas

Select best Western High Grown BOPs declined substantially, the below best and plainer varieties too were lower by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/-. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs eased sharply, the below best and plainer varieties too declined Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- and more. Medium BOPs were barely steady. The BOPFs too were tending easier by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-.

Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOP / BOPFs mostly remained unsold due to a lack of suitable bids.

Uva Teas

Uva BOPs barely maintained, the BOPFs were tending irregular. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were easier by Rs.50/- to Rs.80/-. The BOPFs were tending irregular.

CTC Teas

Low Grown CTC BP1s were barely steady, the High and Medium sorts were tending irregular. Low Grown CTC PF1s were firm to easier at times, the High and Medium sorts were firm on last levels.

Low Grown

Select Best and best OP1s declined from last levels, secondaries met with fare demand. Well made OPs declined marginally, below best invoices too were lower, poorer sorts were firm to dearer. Select best OPA s were lower, best and below best sorts were irregularly lower, poorer secondaries showed good interest. Select best BOP1s were firm to lower, best types along with the bolder, mixed types declined sharply. Well made Pekoes along with the bolder types were firm to easier, best varieties were firm, poorer sorts were irregular. Shotty Pekoe1s were firm, others met with good demand.

Select best and best BOPs were firm whilst the others were irregular. BOP.SPs and BOPF.SPs were firm. BOPFs in general were easier. A few select best FBOPF1s were firm whilst the rest were easier. Select best FBOPs were firm whilst the best and below best together with the bolder types were easier. Select best FBOPF varieties were firm whilst the best and below best were dearer, the poorer varieties were lower to last. Premium Flowery teas met with fair demand.

Off Grades

Select best and best FGS1s were lower by Rs.40/- to Rs.80/-, below best and poorer sorts maintained on last levels. Select best and best BMs were firm on last levels, below best and poorer sorts appreciated by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-. Select best and best BPs were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, below best and poorer varieties were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-. Select best and best BOP1As maintained on last levels, below best types were lower by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, whilst poorer types were lower by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-.

Crop intake is moderate.

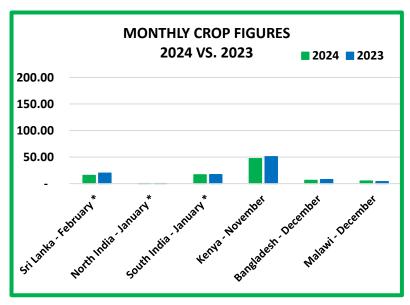


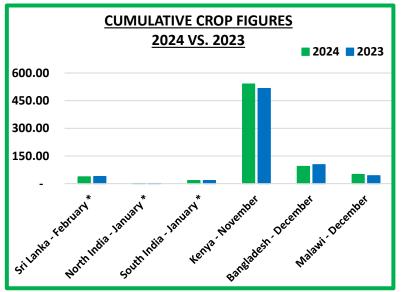

There was good but selective general demand for the 189,658 packages (12,794,932.00 kilos); 31.12% remained unsold.

OFFERINGS

MARKETS

Pakistan Packers, Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries maintained interest at lower levels with Afghanistan and Bazaar less active. Egyptian Packers lent good support but at lower rates while Kazakhstan and other CIS states were selective with maintained enquiry from UK. There was some interest from Russia and South Sudan while Sudan remained absent with Local Packers operating at easier rates. Somalia were more active at the lower end of the market.

LEAF GRADES (M2 & M3)

BP1:

Best – Irregular ranging between USC12 dearer with few lines up to USC24 above previous rates to easier by up to USC16.

Brighter – Saw irregular interest and ranged between USC20 dearer to easier by up to USC24.

Mediums – Some KTDA mediums gained up to USC18 while others irregularly lost up to USC22. Plantation mediums shed up to USC14 with many invoices remaining unsold.

Lower Medium – Eased by up to USC17.

Plainer - Lost up to USC10

PF1:

Best – Mostly easier by up to USC21 but select teas were USC6 dearer.

Brighter – Mostly easier by up to USC14 but a few teas gained up to USC4.

Mediums – KTDA mediums were mostly discounted by up to USC21 with select lines USC4 above previous rates. Plantation mediums shed up to USC20 with a few lines appreciating by up to USC6.

Lower Medium - Irregular and ranged between USC15 dearer to mostly easier by up to USC16.

Plainer – Irregular varying between USC16 dearer to USC8 below previous rates.

DUST GRADES (M1)

PDUST:

Best – Eased by up to USC26 but select invoices were USC8 above last rates.

Brighter - Lost up to USC10.

Mediums – KTDA mediums shed up to USC11 while some lines were USC2 dearer with improved enquiry from plantation mediums which gained up to USC17.

Lower Medium – Firm to mostly dearer by up to USC9 to easier by up to USC3.

Plainer – Eased by up to USC9 with some lines advancing by up to USC7.





MOMBASA MARKET – Continued;

DUST1:

Best – Saw irregular enquiry ranging between firm to USC6 dearer to mostly easier by up to USC16.

Brighter – Irregular absorption ranging between steady to USC10 dearer to USC12 below previous rates.

Mediums – KTDA mediums were irregular and ranged between USC10 dearer to easier by up to USC8. Plantation mediums saw more interest advancing by up to USC15.

Lower Medium – Were up to USC9 above previous rates to easier by up to USC6.

Plainer – Firm to mostly dearer by up to USC10 to easier by USC8.

SECONDARY GRADES (S1)

In the Secondary Catalogues, best BPs held value while others gained; PFs were firm with most cleaner types tending dearer. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings appreciated while similar DUSTs held value. Other Fannings were irregular and mostly steady with DUSTs selling at previous rates. BMFs were well absorbed.

CTC LEAF: 44,759 packages of tea met a restricted demand.

BROKENS/FANNINGS: A handful of clean liquoring teas on offer met with a fairly good demand and sold at around last levels. All other varieties witnessed much less demand and were subjected to heavy withdrawals. BLF teas were again difficult of sale and withdrawals were heavier.

DUST: 2,965 packages of tea on offer met with a fair demand. A select few clean liquoring Dusts sold well at slightly easier rates. Remainder, mostly reprinted saw only limited demand with heavy withdrawals. Blenders lent fair support with improved interest from the loose tea buyers.
