0.97Mkg of Ex-Estate teas on offer met with lower demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs declined, the below best and plainer varieties followed a similar trend. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs declined substantially following quality, the below best and plainer varieties declined to a lesser extent. Nuwara Eliya BOPs declined, the BOPFs too were tending lower. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were irregularly lower, the BOPFs declined from last week's levels. Uva BOPs declined sharply, the BOPFs too eased from last week's levels. Low Grown CTC BP1s mostly remined unsold. The High and Medium sorts were mostly lower. Low Grown CTC PF1s were irregularly lower. The High and Medium sorts declined with some invoices remaining unsold due to a lack of suitable bids.

The 2.1Mkg of Low Grown teas on offer met with lower demand. In the Leafy segment, OP/ OPAs declined substantially. OP1s met with mixed interest. BOP1s met with irregular demand. PEKOEs were lower, PEKOE1s met with good demand. In the Small Leaf segment, well-made FBOPs were firm, bolder types were lower to last. All FBOPF1s were firm on last. BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOP.SPs were firm. Well-made BOPs were lower to last, others were firm. FBOPF varieties were firm. Premium Flowery teas met with fair demand.

Turkey, Russia and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Libya and Iraq were active.



MARKET DESCRIPTION

Western Teas

Select best Western High Grown BOPs declined Rs.40/- to Rs.60/- and more, the below best and plainer varieties too declined by a similar margin. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs declined Rs.80/- to Rs.100/- on average, the below best and plainer varieties declined by Rs.60/- to Rs.80/- and more with a considerable volume remaining unsold. Medium BOPs were irregularly lower. The BOPFs declined Rs.20/- to Rs.40/- on average.

Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOPs barely maintained. The BOPFs declined Rs.50/- and more at times.

Uva Teas

Uva BOPs declined sharply. The BOPFs too followed a similar trend. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were irregularly lower. The BOPFs too declined by Rs.20/- to 40/- on average.

CTC Teas

Low Grown CTC BP1s mostly remained unsold. The High and Medium sorts were mostly lower. Low Grown CTC PF1s were irregularly lower. The High and Medium sorts declined with some invoices remaining unsold due to a lack of suitable bids.

Low Grown

Select best and best OP1s met with reasonable demand, secondaries were irregular. Well-made OPs declined substantially, secondaries too were lower to last. OPAs in general met with lower interest. Well-made BOP1s were firm, others met with irregular demand. Well-made Pekoes along with the bolder types were irregular, others were lower to last. All Pekoe1s met with attractive demand.

BOPs in general were easier. BOP.SPs, BOPF.SPs and BOPFs were firm. All FBOPF1s in general were firm. Well-made FBOPs were firm, whilst the bolder types were easier. FBOPFs in general were firm. Premium Flowery teas were met with fair demand.

Off Grades

Select best FGS1s were firm on last levels whilst best types depreciated by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/- and more towards the closure, below best and poorer sorts were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-. Select best and best BMs depreciated by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, below best and poorer sorts were firm on last levels. Select best and best BPs were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.60/- and more towards the closure, below best and poorer varieties maintained on last levels. Select best BOP1As were higher by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, best types were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-, below best types were lower by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-, whilst poorer types were lower by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-.

Dust

Select best and best Dust1s were firm, below best and poorer types declined by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/-. All High & Medium CTCs declined by Rs. 40/- to Rs.60/- and more. Low Grown CTCs declined by Rs.50/-. Select best and best Low Grown Dust/Dust1s declined by Rs. 50/- to Rs.80/-.

MOMBASA MARKET

SALE NO. 19 - SALE OF 12TH / 13TH MAY 2025

Demand remained fair at irregular rates for the 188,879 packages (12,933,401.00 kilos) available in the market; 39.63% remained unsold.

OFFERINGS

Leaf Grades	-	96,120 packages (6,324,465.00 kilos) – 49.42% unsold.
Dust Grades	-	76,860 packages (5,765,786.00 kilos) – 32.55% unsold.
Secondary Grades	-	15,899 packages (843,150.00 kilos) – 14.71% unsold.

MARKETS

Pakistan Packers showed more activity while Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries, Kazakhstan and other CIS states were strong and dominant. Bazaar showed less interest while Afghanistan lent some support. UK maintained enquiry with Egyptian Packers more active but at lower rates. Russia and South Sudan showed less participation with Sudan absent. Local Packers reduced interest while Somalia maintained support at the lower end of the market.

LEAF GRADES (M2 & M3)

BP1:

Best – Met improved absorption, appreciating by up to USC96.

Brighter - Gained up to USC24 but a few lines shed up to USC7.

Mediums – KTDA mediums saw irregular enquiry and ranged between firm to USC15 above previous rates to easier by up to USC12. The nominal weight of plantation mediums available, ranged b USC34 dearer to easier by up to USC10.

Lower Medium – Met less enquiry and shed up to USC20. Plainer – Lost up to USC7.

PF1:

Best – Irregularly easier by up to USC24.

Brighter – Eased by up to USC21.

Mediums – KTDA mediums met irregular interest and ranged between firm to USC9 above previous rates to easier by up to USC13 while plantation mediums lost up to USC10.

Lower Medium – Some invoices were up to USC7 dearer with others easier by up to USC5. **Plainer** – Mostly shed up to USC14 but select teas were up to USC3 above last levels.

DUST GRADES (M1)

PDUST:

Best – Saw irregular enquiry and ranged between firm to USC19 above previous rates to easier by up to USC6.
Brighter – Shed up to USC18.
Mediums – KTDA mediums met irregular interest at steady to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC15 while plantation mediums lost up to USC28.
Lower Medium – Eased by up to USC27 with some lines USC36 below previous levels.
Plainer – Irregularly shed up to USC19.

DUST1:

Best – Some invoices advanced up to USC15 with others mostly easier by a similar margin.
Brighter – Lost up to USC13 but some teas appreciated by up to USC9.
Mediums – KTDA mediums gained up to USC23 while plantation mediums eased up to USC10.
Lower Medium – Were discounted by up to USC12.
Plainer – Shed up to USC16.

SECONDARY GRADES (S1)

In the Secondary Catalogues, best **BPs** were steady to irregularly dearer while others were about firm; **PFs** tended easier. Clean well sorted coloury **Fannings** were about steady while **similar DUSTs** held value with some teas USC15 easier. **Other Fannings** were fully firm with **DUSTs** steady. **BMFs** were readily absorbed at previous levels.

CHITTAGONG MARKET SALE NO. 02 – 12TH MAY 2025

CTC LEAF: 22,239 packages of tea on offer once again met with a fairly strong demand.

BROKENS/FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring varieties continued to be a strong feature of the sale and witnessed more competition and these could be quoted between Tk.270/- and Tk.300/-. Below best varieties were again a good market but prices eased slightly and these sold between Tk.235/- and Tk.250/-. The remainder again met with a fair demand at slightly easier rates and prices realised between Tk.200/- and Tk.225/-. BLF teas sold fairly well and sold between Tk.160 and 205/-.

DUST: 2,796 packages of tea on offer met with a fairly strong demand. Good liquoring Dusts met with a good demand and prices were irregular closely following quality. Others also sold at around last levels with hardly any withdrawals. Blenders lent good support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: Demand this week was a little more widespread with a few more buyers participating in the sale. The best varieties were mostly firm but all others eased a little in line with quality. Blenders continued to lend strong support with more interest from the Loose tea buyers.

All CDs were the strong feature of the sale.

DISPENSATIONS FOR CATALOGUING OF TEAS NON-CORPORATE SECTOR TEA FACTORIES

Reference is made to Circular No. 27 of 2022 dated August 5, 2022, and Circular No. 41 of 2022 dated December 13, 2022, regarding the above subject.

The existing methodology adopted by the Office of the CTTA for granting dispensations for the cataloguing of teas has been revised, due to the withdrawal of recommending dispensations concerning non-corporate sector tea factories by the Sri Lanka Tea Factory Owners' Association.

The following updated procedure is now in force with immediate effect, for the Non-Corporate Sector Tea Factories. Dispensation procedure for RPCs remains unchanged:

- Requests from the non-corporate sector tea manufacturers seeking dispensation should be made directly to the Office of the CTTA.
- Such requests should be addressed to the Office of the CTTA, via email, with copies sent to the relevant Broker/s and the CBA Convener.

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DISPENSATIONS FOR CATALOGUING OF TEAS NON-CORPORATE SECTOR TEA FACTORIES

- Requests must include:
- Full details of selling marks
- Invoice numbers
- Tea Factory Registration Number.
- At the time of the request is made exact location of the transport vehicle.
- Expected time of arrival at the brokers' warehouse
- The Office of the CTTA will assess all requests on a case-by-case basis.
- All such requests should reach the Office of the CTTA before the cut-off time on the catalogue closing date.
- Brokers are encouraged to educate and convince factories to dispatch their teas to the respective warehouses well in advance to minimize the need for dispensation.
- No requests will be entertained after the catalogue cut-off time under any circumstances.
