A selective and rather easier market prevailed at the Global tea auction centres last week, with only the best and brighter teas gaining in price, whilst the poorer quality teas eased.

1.0Mkg of Ex- Estate teas on offer met with lower demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs gained selectivity for a handful of invoices, the below best sorts appreciated marginally, however some of the poorer sorts declined. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs were irregularly easier following quality, the below best and plainer sorts were irregular but mostly easier. Nuwara Eliya BOPs were tending easier, BOPFs barely maintained last levels. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were firm to marginally dearer, the BOPFs maintained last levels. Uva BOPs were firm to selectively dearer, the BOPFs were mostly easier. Low Grown CTC BP1s were tending irregular, the High and Medium sorts followed a similar trend. Low Grown CTC PF1s declined, the High and Mediums sorts were irregularly lower.

The 3.0Mkg of Low Grown teas on offer met with fair demand. In the Leafy segment, OPs / OPAs were firm. OP1s sold at last levels. BOP1s were firm to easier. PEKOEs were lower to last. PEKOE1s met with good demand. In the Small Leaf segment, well-made FBOPs were firm, bolder types were irregular. FBOPF1s were firm. BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOP.SP and BOPs declined mostly, experiencing lesser demand. Well-made FBOPF declined substantially. Premium Flowery teas were lower to last.

Turkey, Russia and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Libya and Iraq were active.



MARKET DESCRIPTION

Western Teas

Select best Western High Grown BOPs gained selectively, a few below best types gained marginally by Rs.50/-, however the poorer sorts mostly declined. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs appreciated selectively for a handful of invoices, the others were mostly easier, the below best types were marginally dearer at times, however the others together with the poorer sorts declined by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/- on average. Medium BOPs were firm to Rs.50/- dearer at times. The BOPFs were firm to Rs.20/- to Rs.40/- easier.

Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOPs were tending easier. The BOPFs barely maintained last levels.

Uva Teas

Uva BOPs were firm to selectively dearer at times. The BOPFs were mostly easier by Rs.50/- on average. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were firm to marginally dearer. The BOPFs maintained last levels.

CTC Teas

Low Grown CTC BP1s were tending irregular. The High and Medium sorts too followed a similar trend. Low Grown CTC PF1s declined Rs.40/- to Rs.50/- and more. The High and Medium sorts were irregularly lower.

Low Grown

Select best OP1s were firm, best types were irregular, below best sorts met with fair demand. Well-made OPs maintained last levels, below best sorts were irregular, poor secondaries were irregularly lower. Select best OPAs were fully firm, best types attracted better demand, and secondaries were marginally lower. Well twisted BOP1s were firm to easier, rest met with irregular demand. Select best Pekoes were firm, rest eased irregularly. Shotty Pekoe1s were firm, rest met with good demand.

BOPs in general were firm. BOP.SPs, BOPF.SPs and BOPFs were firm. Select best FBOPF1s were firm, others were easier. Well-made FBOPs were firm, whilst the rest were easier. FBOPFs in general were easier. Premium Flowery teas met with lower demand.

Off Grades

Select best and best FGS1s were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/- and more towards the closure, below best and poorer sorts were firm on last levels. Select best and best BMs maintained on last levels, below best and poorer sorts were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-. Select best and best BPs were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/- and more towards the closure, below best and poorer varieties were firm on last levels. Select best BOP1As maintained on last levels, best types were lower by Rs.50/- to Rs.60/-, below best and poorer types maintained on last levels.

Dust

Select best Dust1s were firm, best types declined by Rs.20/-, below best and poorer sorts declined by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-. Low Grown CTCs declined by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-. High & Medium CTCs declined by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-. Low Grown Dust/Dust1s were firm.

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MOMBASA MARKET

Fair general demand prevailed for the 213,819 packages (14,533,510.50 kilos) available in the market with 26.84% remaining unsold.

OFFERINGS

Leaf Grades	-	113,440 packages (7,451,852.00 kilos) – 30.02% unsold.
Dust Grades	-	80,280 packages (6,018,045.00 kilos) – 24.84% unsold.
Secondary Grades	-	20,099 packages (1,063,613.50 kilos) – 16.92% unsold.

MARKETS

Pakistan Packers maintained good enquiry with Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries active but at lower levels. There was strong support from Kazakhstan and other CIS states with maintained activity from Bazaar and Afghanistan. UK were active but selective while Egyptian Packers showed more interest. Russia improved participation while Sudan remained absent. South Sudan were less active with Local Packers showing interest based on price. Somalia maintained enquiry at the lower end of the market.

LEAF GRADES (M2 & M3)

BP1:

Best – Firm to mostly dearer by up to USC46 but some lines shed up to USC30.

Brighter – Irregularly gained up to USC44 with some teas discounted by up to USC15.

Mediums – KTDA mediums mostly appreciated by up to USC50 but a few lines lost up to USC17 with plantation mediums steady to USC12 above previous rates.

Lower Medium – Saw irregular interest and ranged between firm to mostly dearer by up to USC26 to easier by up to USC5.

Plainer – Were steady to USC6 dearer to easier by up to USC2.

PF1:

Best – Irregular and varied between USC19 dearer to USC12 below previous rates.

Brighter – Met irregular enquiry and ranged between USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC10.

Mediums – KTDA mediums were steady to mostly dearer by up to USC19 but select lines lost up to USC3 while plantation mediums gained up to USC11 with a few invoices USC15 below last rates.

Lower Medium – Improved absorption and varied between firm to USC12 dearer to easier by up to USC3.

Plainer – Steady to USC8 above previous rates to easier by up to USC10.

DUST GRADES (M1)

PDUST:

Best – Met irregular interest varying between steady to USC13 above previous levels to easier by a similar margin with some teas discounted by up to USC20 and USC28. **Brighter** –Irregular enquiry at mostly dearer levels by up to USC19 to easier by up to USC8 with some teas further discount by up to USC23.

Mediums – KTDA mediums were steady to mostly dearer by up to USC22 to easier by up to USC5 while plantation mediums lost up to USC16.

Lower Medium – Mostly shed up to USC10 with select lines up to USC5 above last rates.

Plainer – Saw irregular enquiry ranging between firm to USC9 above previous rates to easier by up to USC4.



MOMBASA MARKET – Continued ;

DUST1:

Best – Mostly advanced by up to USC14 but some invoices shed up to USC2.

Brighter – Gained by up to USC17 with select lines discounted by up to USC6.

Mediums – KTDA mediums were firm to USC22 above previous levels to easier by up to USC14 with plantation mediums discounted by up to USC10.

Lower Medium – Firm to USC3 dearer to easier by USC1.

Plainer – Ranged between steady to USC5 dearer to easier by up to USC7.

SECONDARY GRADES (S1)

In the Secondary Catalogues, **BPs** held value while **PFs** were irregular. Clean well sorted coloury **Fannings** were firm with **similar DUSTs** mostly steady while some lines were up to USC16 dearer. **Other Fannings** sold at around previous levels with **DUSTs** firm. **BMFs** were readily absorbed at steady rates.

CHITTAGONG MARKET SALE NO. 04 – 26TH MAY 2025

CTC LEAF: 25,948 packages of tea on offer met with a strong demand.

BROKENS/FANNINGS: Well made good liquoring types met with a stronger demand at mostly dearer rates and could be quoted between Tk.280/and Tk.310/-. Below best were also a fairly strong market and were firm to slightly dearer selling between Tk.240/- and Tk.260/-. All other varieties were in good demand and were generally firm and these could be quoted between Tk.200/- and Tk.220/-. BLF teas sold quite well between Tk.160 and Tk.234/-.

DUST: 5,274 packages of tea on offer met with a good demand. Good liquoring Dusts sold well at around last levels. Their Mediums were also fully firm to slightly dearer closely following quality. Plain/BLF Dusts were well competed for and prices appreciated on quality. Blenders lent good support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers.

COMMENTS: A stronger demand prevailed this week with the better sorts fetching good competition. Blenders lent useful support with more interest from the Loose tea buyers.

Dusts sold well.


