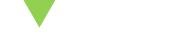

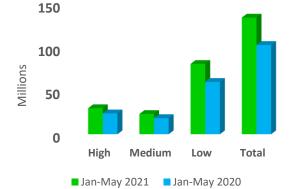




Sri Lanka harvested a crop of 30.3Mkg during the Month of May 2021 which is a positive variance of 5% when compared to the crop harvested in May 2020. The main contributor for the 30.3Mkg was from the Low Grown planting districts with 58.3%, followed by the High Growns at 23.6% and the Medium Grown at 19.5%. When compared with the 2020 harvest, positive variances have been recorded in the Low Growns at 9% and High Growns at 6% ,whilst the Medium Growns recorded a negative variance of 1%.

The 1.0Mkg of Ex Estate teas on offer met with lower demand. Select best Western High Grown BOPs declined, the below best and plainer varieties too were barely steady. Select best Western High Grown BOPFs eased Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, the below best and plainer varieties too were lower however, teas with more colour maintained. The limited selection of Nuwara Eliya BOPs met with lower demand, the BOPFs were dearer following quality. Udapussellawa BOPs were firm, the BOPFs too maintained. Uva BOPs were irregular, but mostly tending lower. Uva BOPFs were firm to easier following quality. Low Grown CTC BP1s barely maintained, the High and Medium sorts were irregular. Low Grown PF1s were firm to a little easier at times, the High and Medium sorts were mostly lower.

The 3.1Mkg of Low Grown teas which were on offer met with lower demand. Select best and best OP1s declined by a few rupees. Well-made BOP1s were lower to last, others too met with lower demand. Select best and best OP/OPAs shed few rupees. Well-made Bold Pekoes were firm to irregularly lower. Shotty PEKOE1s maintained last levels, others declined a few rupees. In the Small Leaf segment, select best BOP.SP / BOPF.SP and BOPFs met with fair demand. Select best and best BOPs were firm. Well-made FBOPs met with good demand, others declined following quality. Select best FBOPF1s were firm, others were lower to last. FBOPFs attracted reasonable interest. All Premium Flowery teas met with fair demand.

Turkey, Russia, Iran and the C.I.S. countries lent fair support. Libya and Iraq were selective.





MARKET DESCRIPTION

Western Teas

Best BOPs shed Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best and plainer types declined Rs.20/-. Best BOPFs eased Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best and plainer types shed Rs.10/- to Rs.20/- and at times more towards the close. Well-made Medium BOPs appreciated Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, the balance were irregularly lower to last. BOPFs on offer met with irregular demand following quality.

Nuwara Eliya Teas

There were only limited BOPs on offer that sold well. Better BOPFs advanced sharply, the balance were firm.

Uva Teas

Uva BOPs met with irregular demand. Better BOPFs were firm, the balance shed Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Udapussellawa BOPs met with irregular demand. Better BOPFs were firm, the balance declined Rs10/-.

CTC Teas

Low Grown BP1s met with less demand and were mostly neglected. PF1s declined Rs.10/- per kg. Medium Grown BP1s met with less demand. PF1s shed Rs.10/-. High Grown BP1s met with less demand. Better PF1s were firm to Rs.10/- dearer at times for some selected invoices, the balance declined by a similar margin.

MARKET DESCRIPTION



Low Grown

Better twisted OP1s met with fair demand, bolder types however declined from last levels and more based on quality. Select best OPs were mainly firm, best types declined by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, others declined by Rs.20/- and more at times. Well-made OPAs were firm to lower by Rs.10/-, below best types declined by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-. Better twisted BOP1s were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, bolder types too eased by a similar price level. Pekoes in the select best and best categories were firm to easier, bold Pekoe reducers and mixed invoices declined substantially. Shotty Pekoe1s met with fair demand, reducers were lower by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-.

Select best BOPs were firm, best and below best types were irregularly lower by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-, secondary types too were lower to last. Select best and best BOP.SPs and BOPF.SPs were firm, others were lower to last by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-. BOPFs followed a similar trend. Select best FBOPF1s were firm, best and below best types were lower by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-, poor secondaries met with lower demand. Well-made FBOPs in the select best category met with good demand, best types were firm, below best types were lower by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-, secondary types were lower to last. FBOPF varieties met with good demand. All Premium Flowery teas met with good demand.

Off Grades

Select best and best Fgs1s were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best and poorer types declined by Rs.30/- to Rs.40/-. Select best BMs were dearer by Rs.20/-, best types were firm, below best and poorer types were dearer by Rs.10/-. Select best and best BPs were dearer by Rs.30/- to Rs.40/-, below best and poorer types were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Select best and best BOP1As were dearer by Rs.10/- whilst below best and poorer sorts were firm to lower by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-.

Dust

Select best Dust1s were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, best and below best Dust1s were lower by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. clean secondaries were lower by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, others were irregular. Best High & Medium CTCs were irregular, others were firm to easier by Rs.10/-. Best Low Grown CTCs were firm to lower, others followed a similar trend. Best Low Grown Dust / Dust1s were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, others were irregular.

Crop intakes are moderate to low.

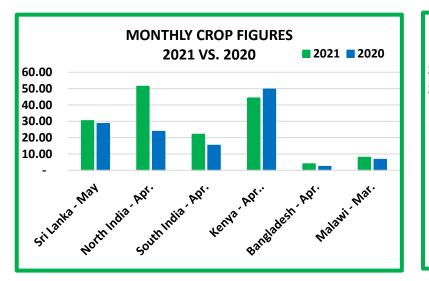


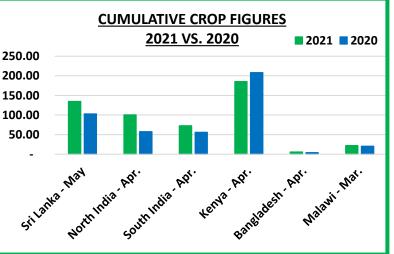

Fair demand for the 186,974 packages (12,294,419.50 kilos) at irregular levels with 12.90% unsold.

LEAF GRADES

Offerings: 99,500 packages, (6,516,675.00 kilos) with 12.26% unsold. Best BP1s on offer shed USC3 to USC39 but a few lines gained up to USC3 with quality while brighter categories were irregular varying between firm to USC20 above previous week's levels to substantially easier by up to USC93. Medium varieties ranged between USC5 to USC6 dearer to easier by USC4 to USC5 with lower mediums varying between steady to USC8 above last prices to easier by USC2 to USC7. Plainer categories met an irregular activity with improved invoices USC2 to USC10 dearer while others eased by USC2 to USC21 and some teas were unsold.

The best PF1s in the market eased by USC4 to USC15 while brighter sorts held firm to USC6 below previous prices with medium categories discounted by USC2 to USC7 and some invoices remained unsold. Lower medium types met an irregular interest ranging between steady to USC8 dearer to easier by USC4 to USC16 with a few lines remaining without bids while plainer descriptions varied between USC3 to USC19 above last prices to easier by USC7 to USC22 and some teas were unsold.

DUST GRADES

Offerings: 58,340 packages (4,304,788.00 kilos) and 12.65% were unsold. The best PDUSTs available were a weak feature easing by USC10 to USC30 with brighter types USC4 to USC8 below last week's rates. Medium varieties lost USC2 to USC17 while lower medium sorts shed USC4 to USC27, where sold with plainer descriptions irregular varying between firm to USC17 dearer to easier by USC5 to USC14 and some invoices remained without bids.

Best DUST1s on offer advanced by USC3 to USC5 while brighter categories met an irregular enquiry varying between steady to USC6 above previous week's levels to easier by a similar margin. Medium varieties held firm to USC2 easier with a few lines unsold while lower mediums were irregular varying between USC20 to USC40 above last prices to easier by USC2 to USC13 and some invoices remained unsold. Plainer sorts were about steady with some teas neglected.

ORTHODOX GRADES

Offerings: 1,520 packages (71,640.00 kilos). Despite the late start of the Orthodox auction, there was no interest on all varieties available for sale.

SECONDARY GRADES.

Offerings: 27,614 packages (1,401,316.50 kilos) and 10.91% remained unsold. In the Secondary Catalogues, BPs eased with PFs steady. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings were firm while DUSTs were easier. Other Fannings held value with similar DUSTs steady. BMFs were well absorbed.

MARKETS

There was reduced support at lower rates from Egyptian Packers, Pakistan Packers, Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries, Kazakhstan, other CIS states, Sudan, Russia, UK and Bazaar. Afghanistan were more selective while Iran showed more interest. Local Packers lent good activity on account of price. Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.
