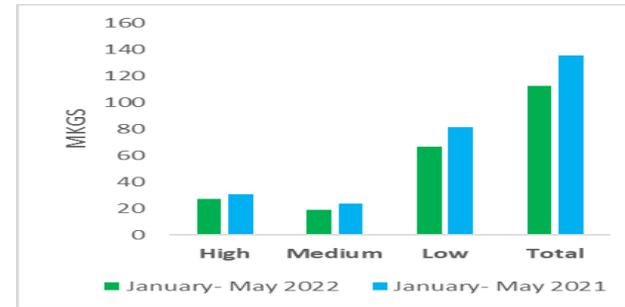
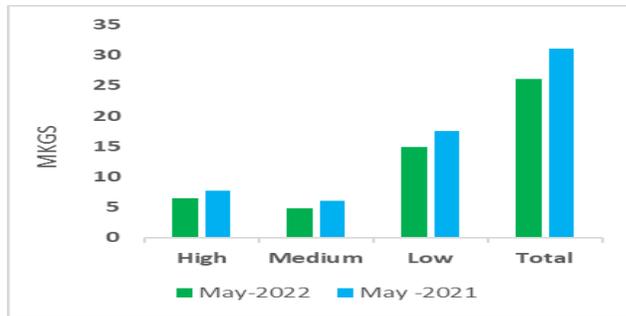


# COMMENTS



Sri Lanka harvested a crop of 26Mkg during the Month of May 2022 which is a negative variance of 16% when compared to the crop harvested in May 2021. The main contributor for the 26Mkg was from the Low Grown planting districts with 57%, followed by the High Grows at 24.6% and the Medium Grows at 18.4%. When compared with the 2021 harvest, negative variances have been recorded in the High Grows at 16%, Medium Grows at 20%, and the Low Grows at 15%.

Sri Lanka Tea Exports for the month of May 2022 was recorded at 19.7Mkg which is a decrease of 17% when compared with the same period of the previous year. The average unit FOB value per kg. was Rs.788.67 above the average unit value per kg of 2021. The cumulative Export quantity for the year recorded a negative variance of 8.2Mkg against the corresponding period. The average FOB value recorded an increase of Rs.264.97 against last year's average FOB price. As a result, the value of Tea Exports for the period (Jan- May) in 2022 recorded a positive variance of Rs.19.2 billion over the previous year. Iraq has emerged as the leading importer of Sri Lanka Tea. The other major importers were U.A.E, Russia Turkey and Azerbaijan.



## COMMENTS - Continued

The 0.80Mkg of Ex Estate teas on offer met with improved demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs gained substantially, the below best and plainer varieties too were dearer. Select Best Western High Grown BOPFs were dearer from last week's levels, the below best and plainer sorts too showed an improvement. Nuwara Eliya BOPs appreciated and sold at attractive levels, the BOPFs too appreciated in value. Uva / Uda Pussellawa BOPs appreciated, the BOPFs gained following quality. Low Grown CTC BP1s were irregularly lower, the High and Medium sorts barely maintained last levels. The Low Grown PF1s appreciated as the sale progressed, the High and Medium sorts were irregularly dearer.

The 2.5Mkg of Low Grown teas which were on offer met with good demand. In the Leafy segment, OP varieties were irregularly lower to last. Better OPAs were firm, others were substantially lower. OP1s met with good demand. In the Semi Leafy segment, BOP1s were firm. Pekoe varieties were lower, Pekoe1s met with improved demand. In the Small Leaf segment, well-made FBOPs were dearer, others met with fair demand. FBOPF varieties attracted improved interest. Better FBOPF1s were dearer, others too met with fair demand. BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOP.SP and BOPs met with good demand. All Premium Flowery teas were dearer.

Russia, Iran and the C.I.S countries lent fair support whilst Turkey was selective. Libya and Iraq were selective.

## MARKET DESCRIPTION

### Western Teas

Western High Grown BOPs gained Rs.100/- to Rs.200/- and more at times, the below best and plainer varieties too were dearer by Rs.100/- to Rs.150/-. Select best BOPFs gained Rs.100/- to Rs.150/-, the below best and plainer varieties too were dearer by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/-. Medium BOPs were irregularly dearer, the BOPFs gained Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- on average.

### Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOPs gained Rs.100/- to Rs.200/-, the BOPFs too appreciated Rs.100/- to Rs.150/- on average.

### Uva Teas

Uva / Uda Pussellawa BOPs gained substantially following quality and special inquiry, the BOPFs too gained Rs.100/- to Rs.150/- and more following quality.

### CTC Teas

Low Grown BP1s were easier from last week's levels, the High and Medium sorts were irregularly lower. Low Grown PF1s appreciated and gained as the sale progressed, the High and Medium sorts too were irregularly dearer.

# MARKET DESCRIPTION

## Low Grown

Select best OP1s along with the bolder types met with good demand, stalky secondaries declined from last levels. Better twisted BOP1s were mostly firm, others were irregular. Well-made OPs were marginally lower, below best types along with the poorer sorts declined substantially from last week's closing levels. OPAs followed a similar trend as OPs. Well-made Pekoes along with the bold Pekoes declined by Rs.50/- to Rs.80/- and more at times, secondaries too were lower to last. Shotty Pekoe1s were firm to dearer, reducers too met with fair demand.

Select best and best BOPs were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best and secondary types were firm. BOP.SP.s and BOPF.SP.s met with very good demand. BOPFs followed a similar trend. Select best and best FBOPF1s were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best types met with reasonable demand, secondaries were firm. Well-made FBOPs in the select best category were dearer by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-, best types too were dearer by Rs.30/- to Rs.40/-, others were firm. FBOPF varieties met with good demand. All Premium Flowery teas met with very good demand.

## Off Grades

Select best and best FGS1s were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best types were firm, poorer types declined by Rs.30/- to Rs.40/-. Select best and best BMs were firm, below best and poorer types declined by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/- and more at times. All BPs were firm. Select best BOP1As were firm, best types met with good demand, others were lower by Rs.60/- to Rs.80/-.

## Dust

Select best and best Dust1s appreciated Rs.20/- to Rs.25/- and more at times as the sale progressed, below best types were firm to dearer Rs.10/- to Rs.15/-, poorer sorts appreciated Rs.10/-. High and Medium CTCs maintained at last levels. Low Grown CTCs appreciated Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Low Grown Dust/ Dust1s were firm to dearer by Rs.10/-.
