COMMENTS



Sri Lanka Tea Exports for the month of October 2022 was recorded at 19Mkg which is a decline of 22% when compared with the same period of the previous year. The average unit FOB value per kg. was Rs.1,172.45 above the average unit value per kg of 2021. The cumulative Export quantity for the year recorded a negative variance of 24.3Mkg against the corresponding period. The cumulative average FOB value recorded an increase of Rs.656.11 against last year's average FOB price. As a result, the value of Tea Exports for the period (January- October) in 2022 recorded a positive variance of Rs.116.3 billion over the previous year. Iraq emerged as the leading importer of Sri Lanka Tea and the other major importers were Russia, U.A.E, Turkey and Iran.

The 0.53Mkg of Ex estate teas on offer met with fair demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs were mostly firm on last levels, the below best and plainer varieties were marginally dearer. Select Best Western High Grown BOPFs were firm to a little dearer at times following quality and special inquiry, however the below best and plainer varieties held firm. Nuwara Eliya BOPs were barely steady, there were hardly any BOPFs on offer. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were irregularly lower following quality, the BOPFs too were irregular. UVA BOPs/ BOPFs were firm on last levels. Low grown CTC BP1s were irregular, the High and Medium sorts too were barely steady. Low Grown CTC PF1s were firm to a little easier the High and medium sorts were irregular following quality.

The 1.9Mkg of Low Grown teas which were on offer met with good demand. In the Leafy segment, OPs were firm, OPAs appreciated a few rupees. Select best and best OP1s were dearer, others too followed a similar trend. In the Semi Leafy segment, BOP1s were dearer. Pekoe varieties were firm, Pekoe1s gained as the sale progressed. In the Small Leaf segment, FBOPs appreciated compared to last levels. FBOPF varieties continued to show improved interest. FBOPF1s were dearer. BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOPSP and BOPs too met with good demand. Premium Flowery teas met with improved demand.

Turkey, Russia, Iran and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Libya and Iraq were active.





MARKET DESCRIPTION

Western Teas

Select best BOPs were firm, a few invoices gained Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- at times, below best and plainer varieties too remained at last levels. Select best BOPFs were fully firm to Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- dearer following special inquiry, the below best and plainer sorts held firm at last levels. Medium BOPs were irregular, the BOPFs were mostly firm.

Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOPs were firm, there were hardly any BOPFs on offer.

Uva Teas

Uva BOP/BOPFs were firm on last levels. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were irregularly lower following qualify, the BOPFs were firm to a little irregular at times.

CTC Teas

Low Grown BP1s were tending irregular, the High and Medium sorts were barely steady. Low Grown PF1s too were firm, the High and Medium sorts were irregular following quality.

Select best OP1s had good demand, bolder types too were mostly dearer, stalky secondaries appreciated irregularly. Well-made OPs were firm, others too gained on quality. Well-made OPAs were firm to dearer by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/-, below best types maintained last levels. In the Semi Leafy segment, well-made BOP1s were mostly dearer, bolder types too gained irregularly. Select best and best Pekoes were firm to dearer, reducers too met with fair demand. Shotty Pekoe1s were firm to dearer, secondaries too gained irregularly.

Select best and best BOPs were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, below best types were firm, secondary types were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-. BOP.SPs and BOPF.SPs met with improved demand. BOPFs followed a similar trend. Select best and best FBOPF1s were dearer by Rs.50/- to Rs.70/-, best and below best FBOPF1s too were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/- and more following quality, secondaries were firm. Well-made FBOPs in the select best category were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-, best and below best types were firm, secondaries too were firm. FBOPF varieties met with improved demand. All Premium Flowery teas were dearer by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- with very good demand.

Off Grades

Select best and best FGS1s were easier by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best and best BMs were dearer by Rs.40/- to Rs.40/-, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best and best BPs were dearer by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-, below best and poorer types were firm. Select best and best BOP1AS were dearer by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/- and more at times. below best and poorer sorts maintained last levels.

Dust

Select best and best Dust1s sold at firm levels, below best and poorer sorts sold at firm by Rs.5/-. High and Medium CTCs maintained at last levels. Low Grown CTCs were firm to dearer by Rs.5/- to Rs.10/-. Low Grown Dust/Dust1s were dearer by Rs.10/-.

MARKETS

Kazakhstan, other CIS states and Sudan lent improved but selective support with Pakistan Packers, Bazaar and Afghanistan maintaining useful activity but at lower levels. Egyptian Packers, UK, Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries reduced interest while Iran showed more enquiry. Russia were less active while Local Packers were outbid. Somalia maintained activity at the lower end of the market.

LEAF GRADES (M2)

BP1:

Best – Reduced competition at firm to USC48 below previous prices but a few select invoices appreciated by up to USC98.

Brighter – Were mostly easier by up to USC28; the lower end however advanced by up to USC15.

Mediums – KTDA mediums saw improved interest at firm to USC20 dearer with plantation mediums irregular varying between steady to USC41 dearer to easier by up to USC30.

Lower Mediums – Irregular ranging between firm to USC16 dearer to easier by up to USC18.

Plainer – Improved interest with most lines advancing by up to USC23 while others eased by up to USC10.

PF1:

Best - Irregularly easier by up to USC39.

Brighter – Firm to easier by up to USC12.

Mediums - KTDA mediums were steady to USC13 below last levels while plantation mediums shed up to USC28.

Lower Mediums – Were irregular varying between firm to USC8 dearer to easier by up to USC17.

Plainer – Ranged between steady to USC22 dearer to easier by up to USC13 with a few invoices losing USC28 and USC43.

DUST GRADES (M1)

Best – Lost up to USC41.

Brighter – Were firm to easier by up to USC12.
