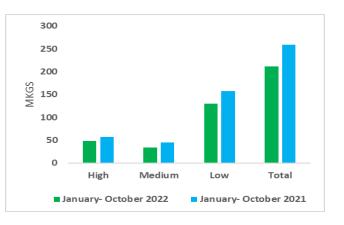


Sri Lanka harvested a crop of 18.7Mkg during the Month of October 2022 which is a negative variance of 22.4% when compared to the crop harvested in October 2021.

The main contributor for the 18.7Mkg was from the Low Grown planting districts with 62.6%, followed by the High Growns at 21.1% and the Medium Growns at 16.3%. When compared with the 2021 harvest, negative variances have been recorded in the High Growns at 19%, Medium Growns at 25%, along with the Low Growns at 23%.

The 0.62Mkg of Ex estate teas on offer met with fair demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs were firm, the below best and plainer varieties were irregular. Select Best Western High Grown BOPFs were firm, however the below best and plainer varieties were irregular following quality. Nuwara Eliya BOPs were firm, the BOPFs were tending irregular following quality. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were easier, the BOPFs were firm to irregularly lower. UVA BOPs / BOPFs were firm. Low grown CTC BP1s were firm on last levels, the High and Medium sorts too followed a similar trend. Low Grown CTC PF1s were barely steady, the High and medium sorts were irregularly dearer.

The 2.0Mkg of Low Grown teas which were on offer met with good demand. In the Leafy segment, OPs were firm, OPAs appreciated a few rupees. Select best OP1s were lower to last, others were dearer. In the Semi Leafy segment, BOP1s were lower. Pekoe varieties were firm, Pekoe1s gained a few rupees. In the Small Leaf segment, FBOPs were firm to easier. FBOPF varieties continued to show improved interest. FBOPF1s were firm. BOPF.SP, BOPF, BOPS, and BOPs too met with good demand. Premium Flowery teas met with improved demand.

Turkey, Russia, Iran and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Libya and Iraq were active.







### MARKET DESCRIPTION

#### **Western Teas**

Select best BOPs were firm, the below best and plainer sorts were irregular. Select best BOPFs were mostly firm on last levels, the below best and plainer varieties were irregular following quality. Medium BOP/BOPFs were firm on last levels.

#### Nuwara Eliya Teas

BOPs were firm, the BOPFs were irregularly lower following quality.

#### **Uva Teas**

Uva BOPs were firm on last levels, the BOPFs too followed a similar trend. Uda Pussellawa BOPs were easier, the BOPFs were easier by Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- following quality.

#### **CTC Teas**

Low Grown BP1s were firm, the High and Medium sorts too followed a similar trend. Low Grown PF1s were irregularly lower, the High and Medium sorts were tending Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- dearer at times but were irregular following quality.

## **MARKET DESCRIPTION**

#### **Low Grown**

Select best OP1s met with irregular demand, bolder types along with the below best sorts were mostly firm, stalky secondaries gained by Rs.20/- to Rs.50/-. Well-made OPs met with fair demand, others too were fully firm on last week's closing levels. Select best OPAs were firm to dearer, best types met with fair demand, below best types declined marginally. In the Semi Leafy segment, better twisted BOP1s were mostly firm, below best sorts however declined substantially. Well-made Pekoes along with the heavy bold Pekoe invoices were firm with fair demand attracted thought the sale, mixed invoices declined marginally. Shotty Pekoe1s were firm to dearer, others too met with fair demand.

Select best and best BOPs were firm, below best types were irregularly lower to last, secondary types were firm. BOP.SPs and BOPF.SPs met with fair demand. BOPFs followed a similar trend. Select best FBOPF1s were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, best and below best FBOPF1s were irregularly easier, secondaries were firm. Well-made FBOPs in the select best category were firm, best and below best types were firm to easier by Rs.20/- to Rs.30/-, secondaries were firm. FBOPF varieties met with improved demand. All Premium Flowery teas met with good demand.

#### **Off Grades**

All FGS1s were firm. Select best BMs declined by Rs.50/- to Rs.80/-, best and below best types were firm, poorer types showed an irregular demand. All BPs were firm. Select best and best BOP1AS were lower by Rs.30/- to Rs.40/- and more at times. below best and poorer sorts were dearer by Rs.20/- to Rs.40/-.

#### Dust

Select best and best Dust1s were dearer by Rs.40/- to Rs.60/-, below best and poorer types were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. High and Medium CTCs were dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Low Grown CTCs were firm to dearer by Rs.10/- to Rs.20/-. Low Grown Dust/ Dust1s were firm to dearer by Rs.10/-.

There was fair demand for the 220,099 packages (14,810,801.00 kilos) on offer with prices showing irregularly easier tendencies. 29.18% remained unsold.

Dust Grades	-	73,380 packages (5,472,248.00 kilos) – 29.38% unsold.
Secondary Grades	-	21,599 packages (1,110,878.00 kilos) – 11.20% unsold.

#### MARKETS

Kazakhstan and other CIS states showed good but selective interest with reduced enquiry from Pakistan Packers, Bazaar, Sudan and Afghanistan. Egyptian Packers opened slow but improved support as the sale progressed while UK, Yemen and other Middle Eastern countries maintained activity but at lower levels. There was more enquiry from Iran with reduced interest from Russia. Local Packers were more active. There was less activity from Somalia at the lower end of the market.

#### LEAF GRADES (M2)

<u>BP1:</u>

Best – Most teas were steady at last levels but a few lines were irregular and shed USC14 to USC40 with select invoices advancing by USC18 and USC40.

Brighter – Were firm to USC10 below previous prices.

**Mediums** – KTDA mediums met irregular enquiry and varied between steady to USC18 dearer to easier by a similar margin; plantation mediums shed up to USC32 but a few select invoices advanced by up to USC24.

Lower Mediums – Were irregular and ranged between firm to USC19 dearer to easier by USC14.

Plainer – Met reduced competition and lost up to USC20.

#### <u> PF1:</u>

Best – Shed up to USC17. Brighter – Were easier by up to USC17.
